THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Chippewa Local School District is classified as a local school district governed by a locally elected Board of Education. The Board of the Chippewa Local School District is composed of five members elected by the citizens of the District. A regular term is four years.

The Board acts as the governing body of the school district. The Board has the responsibility for operating the District in accordance with the desires of local citizens who elect its members.

The Board's major responsibilities are to employ and evaluate a superintendent and a treasurer, adopt an annual budget, provide needed facilities, consider/approve/reject the recommendations of the Superintendent, and, based on the recommendation of the superintendent and treasurer, makes decisions on building plans.

Board members elect a president and vice-president at their Organizational Meeting in January. The Regular Meeting dates for the year are also set at the Organizational Meeting.

QUESTIONS, CONCERNS, and CHAIN OF COMMAND

Questions and/or concerns regarding individual students are initially addressed with the teacher. When needed, the next step is for the issue to be addressed with the Principal of the school. If required, the issue can be referred to the Superintendent. The Hazel Harvey and CIS handbooks are printed and distributed to each student. The Jr./Sr. High School student handbook is on-line at www.chippewa.k12.oh.us. The student handbooks contain the procedures for resolving students matters

The procedure is effective as the issue is addressed directly with the individuals immediately involved. When evaluating issues, the Board needs to address the issues from the stand point of how the issues impact all students within the district and the total educational program.

THE SUNSHINE LAW - Executive Session

The Sunshine Law is a statutory amendment that contains significant items. It requires an Executive Session is held only by a roll call vote. The motion for an Executive Session must state the reason/s listed in the statute is/are the purposes for the Executive Session. The motion does not need to include the individual name/s which may be considered in the Executive Session. Any person may bring an action to enforce the statute, and the amendment provides for inductive relief and attorney's fees, plus a civil forfeiture of \$100. Should the court determine that the action seeking to enforce the Sunshine Law was frivolous, it may award costs and attorney's fees to the public body.

The reasons for an Executive Session are:

- (1) to consider the appointment, employment, dismissal, discipline, promotion, demotion, or compensation of a public employee or official, or the investigation of charges or complaints against a public employee, official, licensee or regulated individual-individual name/s are not included;
- (2) to consider the purchase of property for public purposes, or for the sale of property at competitive bidding, if premature disclosure of information would give an unfair competitive or bargaining advantage to a person whose personal, private interest is adverse to the general public interest;
- (3) conferences with an attorney for the public body concerning disputes involving the public body that are subject to pending or imminent court action;
- (4) preparing for, conducting, or reviewing negotiations or bargaining session with public employees concerning their compensation or other terms and conditions of their employment;
- (5) matter required to be kept confidential by federal law or rules or state statutes;
- (6) specialized details of security arrangements where disclosure of the matters discussed might reveal information that could be used for the purpose of committing or avoiding prosecution for a violation of the law.

B. A RESOLUTION RANKING DESIGN BUILDER AND AUTHORIZING A DESIGN-BUILD AGREEMENT FOR DESIGN-BUILD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Chippewa Local School District ("School District") is undertaking a design-build project in connection with the addition and renovation to Chippewa Intermediate School and High School Auxiliary Gymnasium addition; and

WHEREAS, School District engaged Garmin Miller (the "Criteria Architect") for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the school officials, or a committee on behalf of the School District, has engaged in a two-step best value selection process consisting of a qualifications phase and a request for proposal phase for purposes of selecting a design-builder for the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after careful consideration and evaluation of the information before it, the Board of Education of Chippewa Local School District, County of Wayne, Ohio:

<u>Section 1.</u> Following the two-step best value selection process consisting of a qualifications phase and a request for proposal phase, the School District officials and/or a committee has recommended to the Board of Education, and the Board of Education hereby accepts such recommendation, for the ranking of the following firms it has determine to be the best value to provide the required design-build services for the Project I compliance with Ohio Revised Code Section 153.693:

- 1. The Ruhlin Company
- 2. Simonson Construction Services, Inc.
- 3. Greenspace Construction Services
- 4. Adena Corporation, Inc.

Section 2. This Board of Education hereby authorizes the Superintendent and Treasurer, together with the assistance of the Criteria Architect, to finalize the design-build contract using the form specified in the Request for Proposal stage together with the pricing information provided by the first ranked firm. The Board President and Treasurer are authorized to enter into that agreement when finalized. The Superintendent and Treasurer are authorized to proceed with the portion of the project consisting of the Chippewa Intermediate School Addition and Renovation and shall present to this Board of Education the recommended Guaranteed Maximum Price amendment to that agreement after it is developed and negotiated. The administration shall not enter into an agreement with a Guaranteed Maximum Price that exceeds \$Five and a half million. (\$5,500,000.00)

<u>Section 3.</u> This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board or committees, and that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.
