COURSE FEATURE: EXPRESSIVE MAKERS

Students learn what it means to be a "Maker" in the Expressive Makers elective course. Students will tinker, explore, solve, and construct creative projects while they learn how to use basic tools, computer programs, the Glowforge (laser printer), Cricut, and many other things to assemble their ideas. This course is designed to give students the chance to understand what being a maker is all about and learn some basic skills in which to apply their ideas to the real world.

Students have the freedom to create what they want to make and are always encouraged to try something new, knowing that if they mess up, they can work to fix it. The sky's the limit, in this course, and students have a lot of fun!
