Chippewa High School has been ranked #1 in Wayne County by the U.S. News Best High Schools for the 2023-2024 school year! Various factors such as college readiness, state assessment results, curriculum, and graduation rate impact the ranking and the overall score.

Chippewa scored 80.16 out of 100 and is ranked #133 in the state of Ohio and #3,508 in the nation.



SCHADE GAINS STATE RECOGNITION IN CHOIR

Many people who walk the halls at Chippewa Jr/Sr High School are masking talents that are awe-worthy. One such person is senior, Hannah Schade. Hannah has been involved in choir since her fifth grade year and was recently accepted into the prestigious 2024 Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) All-State Choir.

Each year, the OMEA organizes the All-State Choir. In order to qualify, participants must record an audition. The auditions must include a prepared solo, showcasing various vocal ranges. Over 1200 students from across Ohio sent in audition recordings in May. Of those 1200, only 140 were selected to participate in the All-State Choir. To demonstrate her range, tone, flexibility, intonation and musicality, Hannah sent in her recording and ended up being 1 of 22 Soprano I's chosen to participate in this year's ensemble. This is not an easy task, and in doing so, Hannah has created a distinguished name for herself.

In preparation for the ensemble, Hannah will attend several regional rehearsals. In addition to these rehearsals, she will travel to Columbus for three days of rehearsal with the full choir which will culminate with a performance under the direction of Dr. Hilary Apfelstadt, Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Conducting from The University of Toronto.
