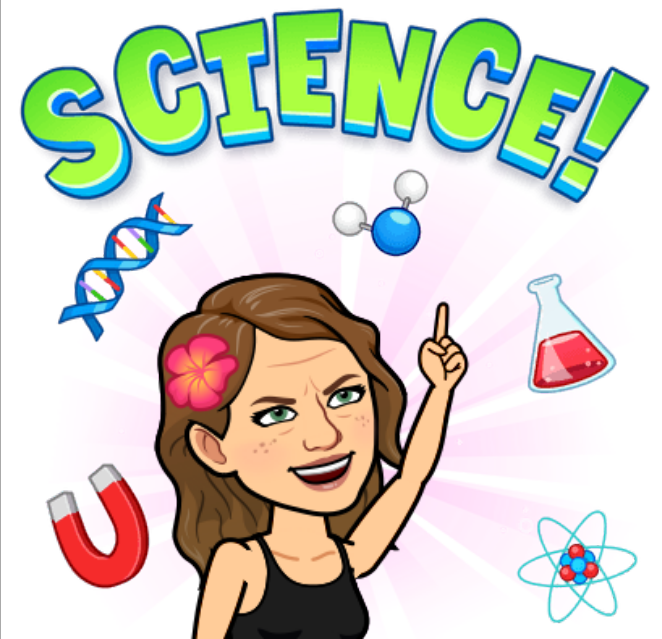

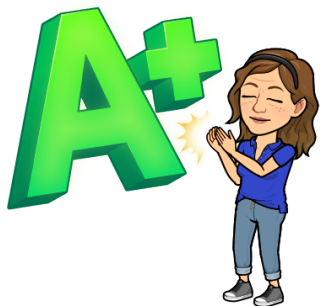

What will I learn?

Welcome to 6th Grade Science! I follow the Ohio Academic Content Standards for 6th Grade Science. This year, our learning will consist of rocks, minerals, and soil, matter, motion, and cells.

The assessments in this course will be categorized as a process or product grade. A process grade will reflect the student's knowledge at any given time during the learning process. This grade might include, but is not limited to, homework, projects, or class work. A product grade will reflect the student's knowledge at the conclusion of a specific study. This grade might include, but is not limited to, tests and quizzes. The process (20%) and product (80%) grades, along with the professional judgement of the teacher, will account for your child's quarter grade.

What if I'm absent?

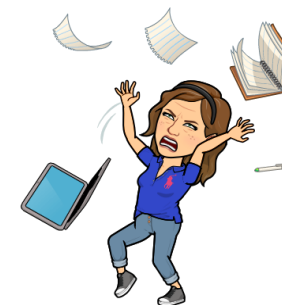
