LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS CHIPPEWA HIGH SCHOOL

The following scholarships are available to seniors graduating from Chippewa High School on a yearly basis. In order to qualify, students must meet the stated criteria and apply for the scholarship, returning the application to the Guidance Office by <u>February 29, 2024</u>.

- **1.** American Legion Auxiliary Post 407 Scholarship Students must have applied and been accepted in a recognized college or university of advanced learning, and have a parent or grandparent who are veterans of one of the branches of the armed services. \$500.00 per year will be awarded for one year of higher education. Completed application is required.
- **2.** American Legion Scholarship Students must have applied and been accepted in a recognized college, university or technical school of advanced learning, and have a parent or grandparent who are veterans of one of the branches of the armed services. \$1,000.00 per year will be awarded for up to 4 years of higher education. Completed application is required.
- 3. Ann D. Homer Black Memorial \$500.00 Scholarship -
 - "When the time comes for me to leave (this life), I'll...hope that I've contributed something worthwhile to the boys and girls I've known during my teaching years."
 - ---Established in June 2013, in honor of Ann Black's many years of dedicated service to the school and especially to her fourth grade students. This scholarship is intended for graduates of Chippewa High School who are pursuing a postsecondary degree in elementary education. The applicants should have a cumulative GPA of 3.0, and submit a one page essay in which,
 - (1) Identifies personal qualities that applicant possesses that will help make you a fondly remembered elementary school teacher and
 - (2) A description of 'something worthwhile' that you hope to contribute to the boys and girls you will come to know during your teaching years. This essay needs to be specific.
- **4.** Ralph and Eloise Busson Scholarship Students must be accepted to a college, university or technical school. Completed application is required.
- **5.** Chippewa Education Association Scholarship Students must have applied and been accepted to a two or four year college. Applicants with a parent or guardian who is a member of a union will be given

preference although others may apply. The scholarship is a one-time award of up to \$1000 and may be awarded up to 4 recipients. Completed application is required with an additional well written, typed essay. The essay should be approximately 150 words discussing the applicant's goals for the future and how his/her education at Chippewa has prepared them to meet those goals.

- **6.** Chippewa Excellence Foundation Scholarship Students must have applied and been accepted at a bonafide institution of higher learning in a 2-year or 4-year degree granting program. \$500.00 per year will be awarded for up to 4 years of higher education. Completed application is required.
- 7. Chippewa High School Class of 1967 Scholarship An endowment bestowed through the generosity of alumni to commemorate the 50th anniversary of their graduation from Chippewa High School created this scholarship. A one-time award of \$500 will be available for a Chippewa senior who has been accepted to an institution of higher learning offering academic degrees or professional certifications, including, but not limited to universities, colleges, academies, seminaries, conservatories, technology, vocational or trade schools. Requirements include having a minimum GPA of 2.75, showing support for our school and community, and exemplifying leadership. Involvement in extra-curricular activities, service, volunteerism, and work experience shall be considerations.
- 8. Chippewa Touchdown Club Scholarship Applicant must have played football from peewee through high school. This scholarship is for \$500.00. (See additional paper at the end of this packet for additional criteria on scholarship.) Students must have applied, been accepted and attending a recognized college, university or technical school of advanced learning.
- **9.** Chippewa Twp. Fire Fighters Assoc. This scholarship is for students pursuing a degree in an emergency medical tech program, fire science, or paramedics. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$500.00 to any student entering into a Fire Science or EMS program. This includes an emergency medical technician (basic/intermediate/paramedic) or firefighter certification. A full complete application is required.
- **10. Daly Family Scholarship** This scholarship is for academic achievement and promise. The Daly Family values clear thinking, good planning, and ingenuity. Students must be accepted by any accredited, 4-year college or university in any major, complete the application, and write a short essay about what the student has achieved and hopes to do. The essay may include GPA, SAT, ACT,

work history, and any other descriptors of achievements and plans. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$3000.

11. Doyle Chisnell Scholarship – Students must be accepted at a bonafide institution of learning in a degree granting program in Engineering (Mechanical or Chemical.) A cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above or an ACT composite score of 21 or above or an SAT score of 1100 or above is required. Completed application is required.

12. The Dorothy Downs Memorial Nursing Scholarship

Students must be going into the nursing profession and be accepted to a college or university. A minimum GPA of 3.0 and a complete application is required. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$1,000.

- **13. Doylestown Friends of the Library** Students must be accepted to a college, university or technical school to receive this one-time \$1,000.00 scholarship. A complete application and a minimum GPA of 3.0 is required. On a separate sheet of paper, write an essay on what the role will be of the public library in the future.
- 14. Doylestown Garden Club Scholarship Students must have applied and been accepted at a recognized college, university or technical school of advanced learning. The scholarship is for \$1000 and is for one year. It is based on community service, volunteerism and your school attendance record. A complete application is required with special emphasis on the essay portion of your submission.
- 15. George Bower Skilled Trade Scholarship Students applying to this must be accepted into a trade school or program. Please attach a short essay explaining why you chose this skill and along with your future aspirations. This scholarship is for a one-time payment of \$1000.00. A completed application along with your essay is required.
- **16. George (Ray) Empson Scholarship Award Lions Memorial Tournament Committee** Students must be accepted to an accredited post-secondary education school, vocational, college or university. This scholarship may be used for tuition, room and board or as needed. This scholarship is for 1,000.00. It is non-renewable, but you may reapply.
- **17. Joseph Hajek Memorial Scholarship** Students must be accepted to a college, university or technical school. Completed application is required. This scholarship is for \$500.00.

- **18. J. V. Hartel Music Scholarship** Students must have applied and been accepted at a college. Applicants must have an interest in the field of music. Students must have a GPA of 2.75 or higher and a College Board score of 21 or higher or 1100 on the SAT. Completed application is required.
- **19. Matt Helmick Scholarship** This scholarship is available to a student with a cumulative 3.00 GPA or higher who is enrolled in a college or technical program. This student also must have played in the Chippewa Boys Soccer Program for 3 or 4 years in high school. A full-complete application is required. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$1,000.00.
- **20. Penny Hetsch Memorial Scholarship** Students must have applied and been accepted at a four year accredited college or university. Must be active in LEO Club and/or other community service organizations. Must have participated in Drama and/or other Fine Arts groups such as Band, Choir, Speech Contest, or One Act Contest. Student must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5. If you are interested in this scholarship a copy of your latest transcript needs to be attached to the application along with your essay on the importance of community service. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$500.00
- 21. The Keyes Family Endowed Scholarship Established in May 2011, in honor of Hank and Judi Keyes of Doylestown, Ohio, for their hard work and sacrifices that enabled their three daughters to pursue their educational endeavors. This scholarship is intended for graduates of Chippewa High School, (their daughters' alma mater) who are pursuing their postsecondary education at the University of Akron. Preference is given to a student with a wide variety of interests and experiences. Applicants must have a minimum of 3.25 cumulative GPA to be considered. NOTE: An additional paper at the end of this packet is required to be completed for this scholarship.
- 22. Patricia E. Koch Memorial \$1000 Scholarship—Dedicated to the memory of Patricia E. Koch, a 1963 graduate of Chippewa High School, for her passionate service in the education of severe behavior disorder 3-5 year old children in the Akron public School System. This scholarship is available to graduating seniors of Chippewa High School who have been accepted to an accredited four year college/university and who intend to pursue a career in Early Childhood Education. Applicants should have attained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 in addition to participation in extracurricular activities and/or involvement in community organizations. Completed application is required. Preference will be given to students who can show financial need.

- 23. Dick Ault Lions Scholarship This scholarship is available to a student who has been accepted to an accredited four year college or university. This student must be an active member of the Chippewa High school Leo Club as verified by the Leo Club advisor or Lion liaison. This student must demonstrate academic excellence and community involvement. Please submit a one-page essay on the importance of volunteering and service to others. Please specifically tell us any Leo's or Lion's activities that you have been involved in. A full and complete application is required. The scholarship of \$1,000.00 will be given for 4 continuous years on proof of enrollment from the accredited institution.
- 24. The Robert Lowe Science Scholarship Established in May 2018, in honor of Robert Lowe and his 44 year career in Doylestown teaching, coaching and working with kids and his life-long love of the outdoors and animals. This one-time \$500 scholarship is intended for graduates of Chippewa High School who have been accepted at a 4 year college majoring in a field of science. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and 2 years of high school athletics. To apply, please submit a written explanation why you are choosing your course of study and what influenced your decision.

25. Jamie S. Malinowski Good Character Scholarship -

Distinction: Jamie typically had a quiet, shy demeanor – but she had overcome many adversities throughout her life and demonstrated great compassion and strength of character, especially while caring for her parents as they were severely stricken with COVID-19. She selflessly sacrificed her own safety and well-being to ensure her parents were cared for – paying the ultimate sacrifice, as she herself succumbed to COVID-19.

Eligibility: Current graduating senior of Chippewa High School, located in Doylestown, Ohio who plans to pursue a post-secondary education (including vocational/technical education programs). Applicant should demonstrate a remarkable ability to face challenges, overcome adversity, or display exceptional integrity, loyalty, or compassion while in support of others. Jamie typically had a quiet, shy demeanor and those of similar nature are encouraged to apply. Applicant must submit a brief essay explaining the adversity he/she has overcome or how he/she has helped others. There is a separate application for this scholarship. 26. The Helen and Robert C. Marshall, Sr. Memorial Scholarship

Robert and Helen Marshall were lifelong proponents of education. Their personal, professional and community efforts reflected this dedication. Both were first generation college graduates and teachers in near-by communities, with Helen finishing her teaching career in the Chippewa system. Robert served for over twenty years on the Chippewa Board of Education and was a founding member of the Chippewa Local Excellence in Education Fund.

This scholarship is given by the family in their memory. A one-time scholarship of \$500.00 will be given to one senior each year who has achieved a GPA of 3.0 or higher and has been accepted to an institution of higher learning to pursue a professional degree in education, business or the health field. Being a first generation college student will be taken into account.

A completed application along with a one-page typed, double spaced essay is required. The essay should address the applicant's reasons for pursuing the area of interest, activities that have contributed to this endeavor, and why they value a post-secondary education.

- 27. Don Olney Memorial Scholarship This scholarship is available to a student with a cumulative 3.00 GPA or higher who is enrolled in a college or technical program. This student also must have played in the Chippewa Golf Program for 3 or 4 years in high school. A full-complete application is required. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$3,000.00.
- 28. Rittman Masonic & Eastern Star Scholarship Four scholarships available two to a Rittman High School seniors and two to a Chippewa High School seniors. Must require financial need and have at least a 2.50 GPA and is enrolling in an accredited two-year or four-year college or university on a full-time basis. Include a personal letter describing in no more than one page why you should receive the award. Also complete the application toward the end of this packet specifically labeled for this scholarship. NOTE: An additional paper at the end of this packet is required to be completed for this scholarship.
- **29. Robert and Sarah Smith Scholarship** Students must have applied and been accepted at a two or four year college. Students must demonstrate academic excellence and community involvement. Also, the student must be an active member of the LEO club. Completed application is required. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$1000.00.
- **30. Keegan Starr Memorial Marching Band Scholarship** This is a first year college or university scholarship. It will be awarded to the marching band member applicant who has been recommended by the

band director, based on warmth and caring shown to fellow band members, and the demonstrated ability to make all marching band members feel that they are a worthwhile part of a rewarding organization. Completed application is required.

- 31. The Patsy Taylor Educating the Future Scholarship is offered to any senior at Chippewa High School who has chosen teaching as their profession and has been accepted to an accredited four year college or university. The scholarship is a one-time award of \$500. To apply, please submit a written explanation of why you have decided to become a teacher and what influenced your decision. Preference will be given to students with unique and creative ideas on teaching and enriching the lives of children. Please feel free to share other important plans around your career choice.
- 32. Three Point Club Scholarship Students must have applied and been accepted at a four year accredited college or university or be in enrolled in a Technical Program. Students must have played in the Chippewa Basketball program for at least 3 years, including their senior year. You must show team spirit and leadership, while maintaining a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. This scholarship is a one-time award of \$500.00 and is awarded to one female and one male. NOTE: An additional paper at the end of this packet is required to be completed for this scholarship. Applicants must also submit an application and an essay on "what your basketball experience has taught you about teamwork."
- **33.** Wadsworth-Rittman Hospital Medical Staff Memorial Scholarship There are two scholarships available. One will be awarded to a Rittman High School senior and one to a Chippewa High School senior who has a minimum cumulative 3.20 GPA, on a 4.00 scale, and is enrolled or will be enrolling as a full-time student at a four-year educational institution, pursuing a field of study in the medical, nursing, or health services professions.
- **34. Barry Weidner Golf Scholarship** This is a one-time award of \$500.00 to one male <u>AND</u> one female senior with a cumulative 3.4 GPA or higher. They must have played in the Chippewa Golf Program during their senior year. Students must have applied, been accepted, and plan to attend a recognized two/four year college, university, trade or technical school. If there isn't sufficient applications from golfing students, this scholarship will be open to all non-golfing Chippewa High School seniors who meet the above requirements. A completed application is required.

Chippewa Football Scholarship Guidelines

- 1. Applicant must have played football from Peewee through High School.
 - If the player moved into Chippewa School System we will permit documentation showing the applicant played. Team photos, yearbook photos, certificates, letter from the coach or league will be acceptable.
 - Third Fourth Grade = two points
 - Fifth Sixth Grade = two points
 - Seventh Eighth Grade = two points
 - Four years in High School = four points

TOTAL POINTS = TEN POINTS

- 2. If there is a tie in points from the first guideline we will then use the applicants G.P.A. Whatever, the actual G.P.A. is will be added to the pervious ten points. The applicant with the highest number of points will be chosen.
- **3.** If a tie still remains after the first and second guideline the applicants ACT score will be used. Whatever the actual ACT score is will be added to the total from Guideline one ten points) and guideline two (actual G.P.A.) total points. The applicant with the highest number of points will be chosen.
- **4.** If a tie still remains we will then look at Other Activities the applicant has participated in. These activities can be in or out of school activities. Some examples would be Choir, Band, Leo Club, Student Council, Boy Scouts, and Church organization. We will add one point for each activity. The applicant with the highest number of points will be chosen.
- **5.** All monies will be paid directly to the student as long as they are attending a recognized college, university or technical school. The funds can be used for tuition or for books.



The Team Behind The Team \$500.00 Scholarship

There are two scholarships available. One will be awarded to a Chippewa High School senior boys basketball player and one to a Chippewa High School senior girls basketball player. Students must have applied and been accepted at a four year accredited college or university or be enrolled in a Technical Program. These students must have played in the Chippewa Basketball program for at least 3 years, including their senior year. You must show team spirit and leadership, while maintaining a minimum 3.0 GPA or higher. These scholarships are a one-time award of \$500.00, one for each basketball program. If you are interested in this scholarship a full-complete application is required (from the guidance department), plus an essay on "what your Basketball experience has taught you about teamwork."
